MEDICAL PLAN

The Hononegah Community High School athletic trainer or another certified athletic trainer will be present for all home matches in order to tape and prepare the players for the first game. Ice, water, and tape will be provided at the game site. Hononegah staff will be in possession of a working cell phone at all practices and matches. The Hononegah head coach will maintain emergency contact information for all players and parents at all practices and matches. Hononegah staff will have copies of maps to North Pointe Immediate Care, located at 5606 E Rockton Rd in Roscoe, IL 61073 at all home matches. The Hononegah athletic trainer will make the final determination of player removal from play and/or transport to emergency care.

If injury occurs during warm-ups or outside of a scheduled game the athlete should report to the ATC for assistance. If injury occurs during a match, the first medical staff to the scene will conduct a primary on-field assessment. If the injury is not serious the medical staff will bring the athlete to the sidelines and conduct a secondary assessment. If the injury is serious the tournament ATC will take the field and assist. The ATC will inspect the athlete and determine if transport to the hospital is necessary. In the case of the need for emergency transport of a player, if that player's parent is not available to accompany her, a Hononegah staff member will go with the player. In this situation, the head coach will call the parent(s) to inform them of the situation, and, if necessary, 911 emergency responders.

All major treatment of injuries will be recorded in a medical report by the medical staff that administered treatment. The athletic department will collect the reports at the end of each day of competition. If there is a dispute over the medical care of an athlete this must be brought to the attention of the head coach and athletic director and the incident will be recorded in writing. Situations such as this will be dealt with on a case-by- case basis.

Concussion protocol will be followed by all club members. Any player with a potential concussion will be examined by a health care professional and cleared for return to play by rejoining practices or competition. This examination and clearance will be documented by team staff.
